Sunday, November 6, 2016

Today was another incredible Sunday at the Community Center. The service started with one of the youth, Zavier, announcing that he had surrendered his life to Christ. Since that moment, he explained how his life had changed. He had stopped doing drugs, had obtained a job, and no longer was involved in the drama of the streets.

I gave a talk about failure; our fear of failure, how we should embrace failure, and how GOD uses failure to change our lives. The Jewish people did not accept Jesus as their Messiah, because they felt His crucifixion was the ultimate failure, the proof that He was not the son of GOD. When in fact, it was the world's greatest sacrifice. Jesus died that we might be saved. He bore the weight of our sin, so that we would be forgiven.

After the talk, we formed three discussion groups. In my group, was an older homeless couple who had been regularly attending our Church. They announced that they were going into a treatment center this coming week, to overcome their drug/alcohol addiction. They were concerned and afraid. Also in the group was Monkey, who had been through a similar treatment program. He spent time with them, explaining the process and encouraging them. We then prayed for them. I ask that you keep them in your prayers.

Tami, the young lady in hiding, bravely came to Church. Her trust in GOD was much stronger than her fear of her ex-husband. Fortunately, he did not appear. Thank you for your prayers.

We also had eight youth participate in our pre-baptism class, committed to being baptized next week.

The Community Center also began a new adventure this week. Two of our adult men volunteers are working with the youth on Friday afternoons to make furniture out of pallets. Six youth came early eager to work on this project. They have so many ideas and dreams of what they could make in the future. Like many of us, they need to see that they can accomplish something.
